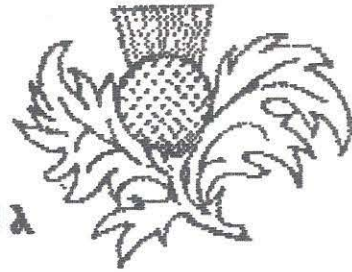

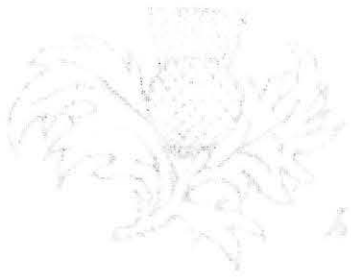

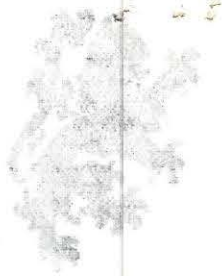

entertainment group from Richmond, The Piper's Dream.

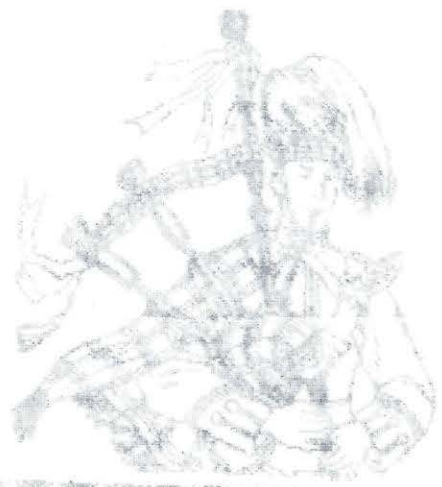
